ORDINANCE No. 2019/2020 - 3

**TENTATIVE COMBINED ANNUAL BUDGET AND APPROPRIATION ORDINANCE
FOR THE McHENRY PUBLIC LIBRARY DISTRICT
FOR THE FISCAL YEAR BEGINNING JULY 1, 2019
AND ENDING JUNE 30, 2020**

WHEREAS, the Illinois Municipal Budget Law, Illinois Revised Statutes, Chapter 85, Section 801, et. seq., as amended, requires all Illinois Municipal Corporations as broadly defined therein, to adopt a combined Annual Budget and Appropriation Ordinance, specifying the objects and purposes of expenditures; and the Illinois Public Library District Act, 75 ILCS 16/30-85, provides procedures for the passage of a Budget and Appropriation Ordinance and a Tax Levy Ordinance; and,

WHEREAS, pursuant to the above and other appropriate statutes, a Budget and Appropriation Ordinance has been prepared in tentative form at the designation of this Board, and has been made available for public inspection at least thirty (30) days prior to final action thereon, and a public hearing on said Budget and Appropriation Ordinance has been held prior to final action hereon, and notice of said hearing to be published on or before August 14, 2019, being more than 30 days prior to said hearing, in a newspaper published within the district.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the President and Board of Library Trustees of the McHENRY PUBLIC LIBRARY DISTRICT, McHenry, McHenry County, Illinois, as follows:

Section One: The following budget containing a statement of cash on hand at the beginning of the fiscal year, an estimate of all cash receipts of said Library District to be received during such fiscal year from all sources, the estimated expenditures contemplated for such fiscal year and a statement of the estimated cash on hand at the end of such fiscal year be, and the same is hereby adopted as the Budget for said Library District for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2019 and ending June 30, 2020, and the same sum are hereby appropriated as necessary to defray the said expenses and liabilities of this Public Library District, for the objects and purposes and in the estimated amounts as indicated, for said fiscal year:

Section Three: There is hereby appropriated from the taxes to be levied for the fiscal year and other sources of income the sum of:

\$ 5,291,228.75

the same to be divided among the several corporate objects and purposes as herein above specified for said Library District purposes for the aforesaid fiscal year.

Section Four: All unexpended balances of proceeds received annually from Public Library District taxes not in excess of statutory limits may be transferred to the Special Reserve Fund, heretofore established according to plans developed and adopted by this Library Board and said unexpended balances shall be accumulated in this fund for the purpose of erecting a new Public Library building, purchasing a site for the same, or building an addition thereto, or furnishing necessary equipment therefor, or acquiring electronic data storage and retrieval facilities.

Section Five: Except as otherwise provided by law, no further appropriations shall be made at any time within such fiscal year, provided that this Library Board may from time to time make transfers between the various items in any fund not affecting the total amount appropriated, or appropriations in excess of those authorized by the Budget in order to meet an immediate and unforeseen emergency by a two-thirds (2/3) vote of the Trustees present and voting, as provided by 75 ILCS 16/30-90 et. seq., and this Library Board may amend this Budget and Appropriation Ordinance from time to time by the same procedure as prescribed by Statute for the original adoption of a Budget and Appropriation Ordinance; provided, that nothing in this Section shall be construed to permit transfer between Funds required by law to be kept separate. Any remaining balances after the close of this fiscal year up to twenty percent (20%) of the appropriation shall be available until August 30th for the authorization of payment of obligations incurred prior to the close of the fiscal year, and until September 30th, for the payment of such obligations, and any remaining balances shall be available for the transfer to special reserve to be accumulated, as provided by 75 ILCS 16/40-50.

Section Six: A copy of this Ordinance in tentative form has been made available for public inspection at the Public Library for thirty (30) days and by publishing in a newspaper published within this Public Library District in substantially the following form:

Section Seven: This Ordinance is passed pursuant to statutory authority and the Illinois Public Library District Act, 75 ILCS 16/30-55, et. seq, 75 ILCS 16/30-85 et. seq.; and 75 ILCS 16/40-50 et. seq.; and the Illinois Revenue Code, 35 ILCS 205/157 et. seq., and other statutes hereunto appertaining.

Section Eight: This Library Board hereby certifies that all applicable provisions of 35 ILCS 215/1 as amended, ("The Illinois Truth-in-Taxation Statute") have been complied with.

Section Nine: Pursuant to 35 ILCS 200/18-165 this Library Board hereby determines that no surplus of funds is available for any debt, obligation, liability, operation, fund or account for any purpose, and accordingly the abatement and reduction of provisions of the Personal Property Tax Replacement Fund Act are not applicable thereto.

Section Ten: This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage, approval, and publication, according to law, and any resolutions or ordinance in conflict therewith are hereby repealed; and should any part of this Ordinance be adjudged invalid or unconstitutional, such adjudication shall affect only that part of this Act specifically covered thereby, and shall not affect any other provisions or part of this Act, but shall be severable therefrom.

VIII. Librarian's Report

The Board reviewed the Librarian's Report

- Scholtz told the Board he had attended a meeting of library directors where they compared their libraries' statistics. Most reported that more people came to their libraries but that there were fewer checkouts and less program attendance. There was more Wi-Fi use but less computer use. Patrons used study rooms more also. Our usage is typical of most of our neighboring libraries.
- Scholtz discussed various ways to increase library income. We could offer notary services, including real estate forms. We have the advantage of being open evenings and weekends. It would not be a lot of income but it could help. Scholtz felt that since our area has so many places for people to get passports, we might not get much money but again it could help. Scholtz said he was investigating selling lottery tickets and had contacted the Illinois Department of Revenue. Schubert and other Board members felt that it was not appropriate for the library and would not allow it.
- Jennifer May will be starting on Thursday. Scholtz reported that she was a popular choice with the managers.
- Scholtz reported that Palatine Public Library has chosen to use First Communications for their phone system as we have.
- Scholtz told the Board about major projects and purchases that the library is facing in this fiscal year.
 - The parking lot is being resealed and striped on August 23 and 24 for about \$19,000.
 - We are buying a utility tractor for hauling snow and for plowing. Scholtz did not report the cost.
 - Internal plumbing repairs will be about \$19,000 and involve tearing up the downstairs front bathroom floors. We expect to be closed for three or more days.

- The sanitary sewer project involves dealing with legal, engineering, and project management issues and is taking longer to complete than expected. Grala asked about the legal issues and Scholtz explained that they involved identifying utility easements. If the delays continue, the work might not begin until spring 2020. The cost is going to be about \$65,000 to \$75,000.
- We are investigating ways to make the internal and external doors more secure by using a fob or swipe method. After the active shooter in-service, we recognized that punching a code into a door under fire becomes very difficult and want to make it simpler for staff to get to a more secure place.
- Scholtz informed the Board on which governmental units had approved or rejected the tax abatement agreement with Jessup Manufacturing.
- Scholtz spoke about how hiring IT consultants was working. He did not feel that CCB was working out and was investigating how to get out of our agreement. He felt that Eder Technology Consulting was working very well for us. They have been working with us on various projects and providing training for our staff. We have a long history with the company's accounting and auditing services.
- Scholtz informed the Board that he was the liaison between McHenry County Librarians and the McHenry County 2020 Census Count Everyone organization. Having an accurate census count would make a difference to our income and participating would be to our benefit. He described the process for the Count Everyone campaign.

XI. New Business

1. Oath of Officers for FY2019-20

Schubert led the newly elected officers in the oath of office. He thanked Grala for her service as Treasurer.

2. Approval of the Tentative Budget and Appropriation Ordinance 2019/20-3

Scholtz explained that the budget document in the Board packet was incorrect because formulas in the spreadsheet had copied incorrectly. He distributed correct budget spreadsheets in the meeting. He pointed out that he printed budget targets that are lower than last year's figures in red.

Scholtz said he has customarily included a line for Cash on Hand in the budget but since that figure is always an estimated figure, he did not include it in this budget this time. As a result, the budget appears to be an unbalanced budget. This was a concern for Carey. Scholtz explained that staff normally do not spend all the money budgeted and that we can transfer money from the Reserve Fund to cover shortfalls temporarily so that we will come out balanced at the end of the fiscal year. Scholtz said he was committed to keeping the actual spending down and would make sure we stay under budget, but that unless we budget as much as we might spend, we would need to file an amended budget later. An amended budget is likely to bring media and public attention, while transferring money from the Reserve Fund would not. Schubert supported Scholtz's position and gave

examples from his experience as a banker and as an observer of other governmental units. Carey continued to express concern. Reilly reminded the Board of his history of fiscal conservatism but stated his support for Scholtz and Schubert's point of view. Scholtz restated his commitment to keep overall spending down but pointed out that realistically some lines may be overspent.

Schubert moved and Reilly seconded a motion to approve the Tentative Budget and Appropriation Ordinance 2019/20-3 and to approve the transfer of funds letter that authorizes moving money from the Operating Fund to the Special Reserve Fund.

Scholtz took the opportunity to speak about why we have not applied for the E-Rate in the past. The application price is very involved without providing us a substantial benefit.

There are consultants who make a living preparing the applications. In addition, we would need to seek bids from service providers and accept the lowest rate without regard for the quality of the provider. Scholtz said that now that we have VoIP phones, it might be beneficial to apply since the situation has changed.

Youth Services

- The Summer Lunch Program concluded mid-August and the number of meals served increased compared to last summer. We served 1,325 meals with 1,398 kids in attendance and 482 adults over the two and half months.
 - August Lunch: 223 meals served, 223 kids in attendance and 63 adults in attendance.
- A.Karwowska, M. Puga, and E.Andrews were presenters at the McHenry Schools' Choice Menu Tri-Conference Teacher Institute Day on August 30. They presented four workshops: Kids' Lit with Classroom Connections Grades K-3; Bilingual Kids' Lit with Classroom Connections Grades K-3; Spanish and English Kids' Lit with Classroom Connections Grades 4-8, and Online Library Resources for Middles and High School Students. Over 60 educators attended the workshops and about 50 stopped by the library booth to learn more about how the library can be of services. The hard work they put in during August preparing their materials and presentations paid off in new requests for teacher outreach services.
- M. Cairo and J.Hume with the help of the Circulation Department attended the two nights of Riverwood School's Open House events. They staffed a booth promoting library services and programs and signed up 54 new cardholders over the two nights.

- M. Puga and A. Morena with the help of the Circulation Department attended McHenry Youth and Family and District 15's back to school event. They staffed a booth promoting library services and programs to mainly Spanish speaking families and signed up new cardholders.
- J. Hume celebrated the graduates of the 1,000 Books before Kindergarten with our annual party and graduation ceremony. This year we had 6 graduates in attendance and many more program participants came to celebrate. Miss Jessie put together a fun time with songs, bubbles, a graduation ceremony, and of course dancing with Baby Shark!
- S. Baseley worked on updating the list of preschool centers within and near the library's district in order to start offering outreach services to the centers. She determined we have over 20 preschools centers locally and will be working together with Jessie to offer storytime visits and teacher services to all of them.
- J. Einoris has taken over the Read Fur Fun program and now has two therapy dogs participating in the bi-monthly program. Kids enjoy the opportunity to practice their reading aloud skills with the dogs.
- L. Jakacki attended the NSDC/OverDrive meeting. The big topic of everyone's mind is the continued efforts of the large publishers to make it difficult for libraries to purchase ebooks on the release date, purchase additional copies to fulfill patron demand and the constant need to repurchase licenses to access ebooks. There is a large outcry about how these purchasing restrictions are hindering libraries and their patrons.

Statistics and Highlights Narrative

Legend – ABk – Adult Books; JBk – Children's Books; PBk – Paperback Books; AudBk – Audio books; JAudBk – Children's Audio books; ILL – Interlibrary loan; Vid/DVD – Videos/DVDs; JVID/DVD – Children's Videos/DVDs; Other The TS Dept. added (-5%) items than last year; withdrew (-33%) items, mended (-38%) items, processed (-6%) items. Patron registrations increased +24% (571 cards). Overall circulation realized a large decrease (-29%) from the previous year/month but we were only open 1 less day (total circ was 46,448 compared to 65,514; ave. daily circ. 1720). Automatic renewals accounted for 36% of the total circulation. Patron count was 18,233 compared to 20,899 (-13%) from last year). All areas of circulation decreased except for ILLs loaned (+3%) and Teen magazines (+22%).

Several NW suburban libraries have been comparing/sharing use statistics with each other. Here are the results as averages: Circulation (+1.7%); patron count (-5.9%); program attendance (-1.5%); meeting rm use (0%); study room use (+4.3%); reference transactions (-3.3%); in-house computer use (-6.8%) and wifi use (+25.2%). Even though circulation is down this month, generally our circulation is up by +12, patron visits up +11%, program attendance down -12%, in-house computer use -12% and wifi use -1%. We have no counts for reference questions/transactions and our meeting/study room counts can't be compared because we used to count hours and now count instances of use. I would say that we are experiencing better overall circulation with increased patron visits, less program attendance, less computer use and less wi-fi use than other area libraries. We have to figure out how to provide more programs with more patron attendance to reverse the trend. Also, it would seem that more patrons are using their own wifi devices in the library than using in-house devices.

Americans with Disabilities Act Compliance (adopted 6/2/1997, updated 9/15/2019)

The McHenry Public Library District (“MPLD” or “Library”) complies with the Americans with Disabilities Act (the “ADA”) of 1990, as amended and offers alternative reasonable compliance to meet its requirements. Accordingly, the Library makes reasonable accommodations in Library policies, practices, and procedures when necessary to avoid discrimination on the basis of disability, unless a fundamental alteration in a Library program would result; and operates its services, programs and activities so that, when viewed in their entirety, they are readily accessible to and usable by individuals with disabilities. The Library provides equal access to persons with disabilities, including those individuals who use Service Animals.

Any person needing an accommodation for a disability in order to access the benefits of the Library’s services, programs, or activities under the ADA should contact the library’s ADA Compliance Officer, Bill Edminster-Assistant Director, or any member of the Library staff. Any person needing an accommodation for a disability in order to attend a meeting at the Library should contact the Assistant Director by telephone at 815-385-0036, by email at bedminster@mchenrylibrary.org or in writing, not less than five (5) working days prior to the meeting.

Any person who believes that MPLD has discriminated against that person because of the person’s disability may file a written complaint with the ADA Compliance Officer, within 60 days of the alleged occurrence of discrimination. The complaint must provide information about the alleged discrimination, including the date, location, persons involved, and other particulars. The complaint must include the name, address, and telephone number of the person filing the claim. The complaint should include the complaining person’s proposed resolution of the matter.

Parking and Use of Parking Lot (adopted 2/19/02, revised 9/15//2019)

Parking is provided for the convenience of patrons using the Library during regular Library hours. Parking lot use during closed hours is limited to library-related business such as meeting room usage, book-drop, and Wi-Fi access. Patrons must observe all parking regulations posted by the Library and/or the City of McHenry. Vehicles in violation of parking regulations are subject to ticketing and parking fines from the City of McHenry Police Department and possible towing at the owner's expense.

- Parking after hours and/or overnight is prohibited. Vehicles left in the Library parking lot after closing may be considered abandoned vehicles and may be towed at the owner's expense.
- The use of the Library parking lot as a staging area for trucks, buses, and vans is also prohibited. The driver will be asked to remove the vehicle from the Library parking lot.
- In the case of vehicle trouble, patrons can arrange to leave the vehicle overnight for towing/repair but patrons must speak to the Person-in-Charge for permission.
- The Library is not responsible for theft or damage to or from vehicles.
- Patrons using the Library's parking lot must conform to all Library policies including the Patron Behavior Policy.

Service Animals (adopted 8/20/2019)

MPLD welcomes Service Animals, and Service Animals are permitted in any area of the Library where members of the public are permitted to go. In order to comply with the ADA and Illinois law (775 ILCS 30 and Public Act 097-0956), it is the policy of MPLD that Service Animals assisting individuals (“handlers”) with disabilities are permitted in all facilities, programs, and activities where employees or members of the community are normally allowed access, except where the presence or behavior of the animal may compromise the health or safety of the animal or others, or fundamentally alters the nature of the program or activity. Trainers are also permitted to accompany Service Animals in training in the Library.

Service Animals are defined as dogs or miniature horses that are individually trained to do work or perform tasks for people with disabilities, including but not limited to physical, sensory, psychiatric, intellectual, or other mental disabilities. The work or task that the Service Animal has been trained to provide must be directly related to the person’s disability. Examples of such work or tasks include, but are not limited to, guiding people who are blind, alerting people who are deaf, pulling a wheelchair, alerting and protecting a person who is having a seizure, reminding a person with mental illness to take prescribed medications, calming a person with Post Traumatic Stress Disorder during an anxiety attack, or performing other duties.

While the library occasionally presents educational programs that feature animals, members of the public may only enter the library with an animal if it is a Service Animal that requires accommodation under the ADA.

The Service Animal must be trained to take a specific action to assist the person with a disability, and the task(s) performed must be directly related to the disability. Emotional support, therapy, comfort, or pets/companion animals do not qualify as Service Animals under the ADA. If it is not obvious that a dog/minature horse brought into the library is a Service Animal, a staff member may ask the following questions:

1. Is the dog/minature horse a Service Animal required because of a disability?
2. What specific work or task has the dog/minature horse been trained to perform?

A staff member attempting to ascertain whether a dog/minature horse is a Service Animal may not ask about the nature of a person's disability.

DRAFT

By ADA stipulation, Service Animals must be under the immediate control of their handlers at all times. Therefore, Service Animals that are not housebroken, bark, uncontrolled, or otherwise disruptive will be required to leave the premises. When there is a legitimate reason to remove a Service Animal, the staff will offer the person with the disability the opportunity to obtain Library materials or services without the animal's presence.

Animals, regardless of purpose, may never be left unattended on library grounds. Service animals are not allowed on library furniture or fixtures and must remain on the floor or be carried (as appropriate) by their handlers at all times. Misrepresenting a dog/miniature horse as a Service Animal is a violation of the Library's Patron Behavior Policy, and may result in the suspension of library privileges.

A. MPLD accepts no responsibility for the care of Service Animals including cleaning up waste from the Service Animal unless the handler is physically unable to do so themselves.

B. MPLD accepts no liability for injury to any Service Animal, or injury to the handler/partner, whether caused by the animal, its handler/partner, another visitor to a the Library, the physical conditions of the Library, or any other circumstance.

C. MPLD accepts no liability for damage or injury to others caused by a Service Animal.

D. MPLD accepts no liability for any injuries or property damage, to the Service Animal, its handler/partner, or others, resulting from the MPLD's failure to enforce this policy or to supervise a Service Animal.

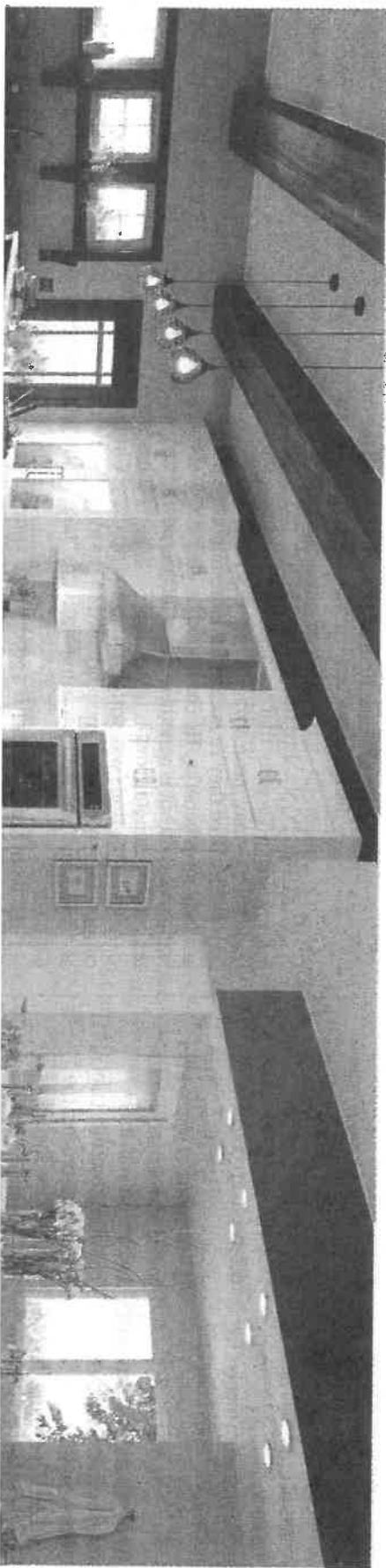
