



# **Library News**

#### Curbside Pickup — Enter from the South!

Just a reminder that we've changed direction for our curbside pickup service. Please enter from the south off Meadow Lane Ave. That way, if you have items to return, you can go through the drive-thru lane first and put your items in one of the bins, then pull up to the front library doors so that your driver's side is towards the building, not the parking lot.

#### **Get a Digital Library Card**

Did you know you can access our digital library 24/7 from the comfort of your home using your computer, tablet or smart phone? You'll need a library card number to download e-content and to use most of our e-services. To get a digital card, look for the link under Library News on our website's home page.

Our digital library includes eBooks, music, audiobooks, movies & TV, magazines & newspapers, learning opportunities, curated research materials, local & family history, and much more.

#### **Library Receives Two Grants**

We're happy to announce that the library applied for two grants from the Illinois State Library and received both! The first is the Digital Network Access Grant for \$10,000. This will be used to replace our WiFi access points throughout the building since our current equipment is at the end of life. After hours, or when the library is closed to in-library visits, patrons can use our WiFi from our parking lot. The north side close to the building seems to have the strongest signal.

The second grant, the PPE Grant for Libraries for \$500, will help defray the costs of some of our PPE (Personal Protective Equipment) purchases for the library during the pandemic.
